NEW LIFE FOR AN OLD FAVOURITE

When he first paid for the creation of a River Garden in Belper, from 1905, Herbert Strutt wanted to make sure that visitors had access to the finest facilities.

Herbert had sold the town's mills and used some of his new riches to transform the marshy land by the River Derwent into a beautiful landscaped garden with a bandstand, rowing boats and of course the Swiss Tea Rooms. Initially, the Belper Boating Association, who ran the gardens, had a small kiosk selling refreshments, but this was swamped at their first event – a water fete which attracted 2,500 people. So Herbert gave them money enough to create a tearooms.

The tearooms were designed in the Swiss style by Herbert's favourite architects Hunter and Woodhouse. Custom-made, the building was T-shaped, in black and white timber. The roof was thatched with heather like the crofts on Herbert Strutt's newly-bought Scottish estates.

Sadly, the heather roof only lasted one season as it leaked very badly (it was rumoured they used the wrong type of heather) so for the new seaon in 1907, the roof was replaced with something more weather-resistant.

But 1907 was a busy year, with 6,000 people visiting on one Bank Holiday, so that the tearooms were just as swamped as the kiosk had been. For 1908, a second building was created near the entrance to the gardens, a pavilion which seated 600 people. At last, everyone who visited could have a cup of tea!

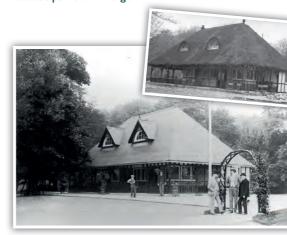
The tearooms remained popular – but they wouldn't have met today's catering standards. There was no running water, so no toilets, not even a sink. It's claimed that once they had a lot of teacups, saucers and plates



needing washing, they had to be piled up in a rowing boat and taken over to a house on Wyver Lane, across the river. They were then washed and returned, ready for the next visitors. The drinking water for teas and coffees had to be brought in as well.

After the First World War, the Belper Boating Association closed and passed the gardens to the company that ran the mills. The tearooms continued to be popular, and had a sandpit created nearby for children to play in. Ownership then passed again, this time to the local council in 1966, and from then the tearooms were less used, and became neglected. They were finally demolished, and replaced in 2020/21. The River Gardens have a tearooms again, at last!

BELPER'S SWISS TEA ROOMS TODAY

The ambitious project to replace the original 1906 building, which has been derelict since 1981, is set to open it's doors once again. During an interview with the café's manager, Helen, I found out that many exciting things are in store for its first year of opening.

Situated in the heart of Derbyshire, Belper is the home to many quirky cafes and shops but none, arguably, can boast of beautiful scenery or a unique history quite like the River Garden's tearooms (see previous page for its fascinating past). The riverside promenade allows easy access to the cafe where your food and drink needs will be very well catered for. Refreshing tea and coffee, sandwiches, burgers, locally-made cake and even a chocolate brownie milkshake are just some of the many items on the menu! Included in these are a wide range of vegetarian, vegan, gluten-free and kid-friendly options, all of which are sourced from Belper's local greengrocers, bakers and butchers.

When asked about the increase of footfall and the potential for litter or damage to wildlife, Helen assured me that the gardens will remain a safe, clean place for both families and nature; bins, daily cleaning, paths and covid safety guidelines are all adhered to for the park and its users protection. Their interest in keeping the community a happy and, importantly, safe place is also reflected in their ongoing dedication to reduce their carbon footprint. For example, their coffee cups are fully compostable, the cafe provides healthy bird seed to reduce birds' consumption of bread, and their loyalty cards, once finished, can be composted and grown into various plants!



With both indoor and outdoor seating, you will have the time to appreciate the surrounding flower beds and shrubberies or even have a go at spotting the variety of bird life (no points for spotting the towering swan pedalos - the park's latest addition!). Along with their growing collection of rowing boats and pedalos, I'm also told that music events, such as the return of brass bands, are one of the many exciting things in discussion for the cafe's first year.

All in all, this is a beautifully located building, in the centre of a fabulous park equipped with a play area and bandstand. With a background view of the East Mill and a five-minute walk into Belper's High Street - awarded 'Great British High Street' of the year - you couldn't ask for a more tranquil setting to entertain your kids or feed your coffee addiction!

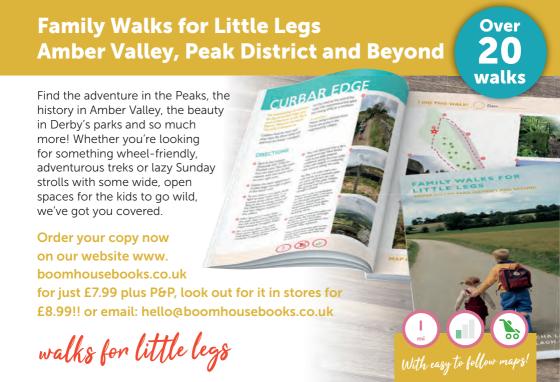

WYVER LANE A WALK ON WHEELS



Derwent Valley Trust are happy to report the completion of the re-surfacing at Wyver Lane, giving a return route of 4km of smooth path on which to walk or cycle from the heart of Belper, going past the beautiful Wyver Lane Derbyshire Wildlife Trust Reserve and along a section of the Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site from Belper Mill north. The re-surfacing has made it possible for families with pushchairs and

wheelchair users to enjoy this lovely part of the countryside as well as leisure cyclists or children learning to ride their bikes.

Wyver Lane is part of a longer proposal to link Derby to Baslow by a riverside trail up the Derwent Valley, linking the Derwent Valley Mills. For more information go to:

Distance: 3 miles return (I+hours)

Difficulty: Easy (Wellies recommended in wet weather)

Wheels Friendly: Yes

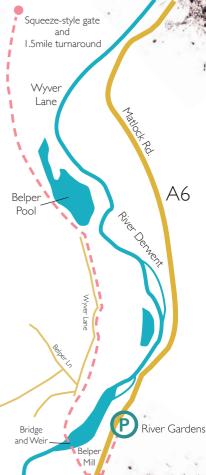
Wyver Lane is an excellent family walk that suits all ages. Children who love to watch trains will have a close-up view of the rail line at the start of the walk, while the adjacent fields have sheep and horses for animal enthusiasts. You will also pass the Wyver Lane Pool Nature Reserve where in the summer you can see swallows, swifts, house martins and occasionally peregrine falcons.

- Park at the River Gardens (parking charges apply).
 Cross the bridge with stunning views of the weir below on the Derwent River
- 2. Take first right onto Belper Lane, and then the first right again onto Wyver Lane.
- 3. Follow the lane as far as it goes, passing beautiful tended gardens and the River Gardens' Park on your right. At the end of the lane, the houses stop but the road continues to the left. The wheels-accessible



walk ends at 1.5 miles from the carpark at a squeeze style gate. Take care not to trespass on the private woodlands to your right. After the squeeze style, you can follow other paths towards Shining Cliff Woods, or turn back for a three mile round trip.

Please note: This walk is wheels-friendly but there are several footpaths off to the left, which you can take if everyone is on foot. Occasionally a car will pass, but they tend to drive very slowly.

Public libraries are a wonderful community asset and Belper's new and improved local is certainly no exception!

Public libraries provide a remarkable service by supplying a diverse collection of fiction, non-fiction and audio books, as well as organising many activity clubs, storytime hours and writing workshops (check out Derbyshire's Facebook and Twitter pages for all up-to-date events). This free service can be particularly invaluable for families.

Alongside this, jobseekers, students and similar are welcome to use the available computers, located in the quieter corners of Belper's spacious library (which was originally an old music hall, before being taken over by Thorntons). You will certainly feel tranquil in this light, airy space with its tall, impressive windows and high ceilings.

Other sectors, such as charities, are also increasingly turning to libraries as a way of improving the health of their community. For instance, the Reading Agency has donated books to Belper's local library as part of the 'Reading Well' Campaign, encouraging adults and children to care for their mental health through reading. All in all, libraries provide a place of peace, community and fun. Come and explore for yourself and discover everything they have to offer - you won't be disappointed!



THE FATE OF THE OLD **BELPER LIBRARY**

Local conservation developer, Tanya Spilsbury, has recently taken on the old Belper library on Bridge Street, reverting it to its former name, "The Hollies". She plans to convert the front of the building into a two-bed house and use the rest of the building to create studios and small business units overlooking the serene rear garden.

Tanya has experience of doing a conversion which is sensitive to the historic and architectural interest of the property and the town. She has donated some of the library fittings and furniture to local community groups and charities, but, given the local attachment to the old library building, she has retained some of the bookcases to furnish the new units and keep a link with its former

Sophie

Sophie Cartmell is a children's author, illustrator, mum and shopowner of Duck & Peach Illustration in Belper's 1924 building.

For almost a decade now, Sophie has worked towards her 'bucket-list' goal of creating her own children's book, having been inspired by the birth of her daughter in 2012. She says the arrival of her baby, combined with her love of picture books was the catalyst for writing 'Mary', her recently published story. 'Mary' combines an important message of resilience, strength and self-love with loveable, 'squishy'-looking illustrations (inspired by images of tea parties, fancy dress and colourful foods). Sophie believes 'It's important to have fun whatever you create - reading should be enjoyable for kids even if you're covering a tricky subject matter'. She hopes her story will teach children to be resilient and strong while always remaining true to themselves.

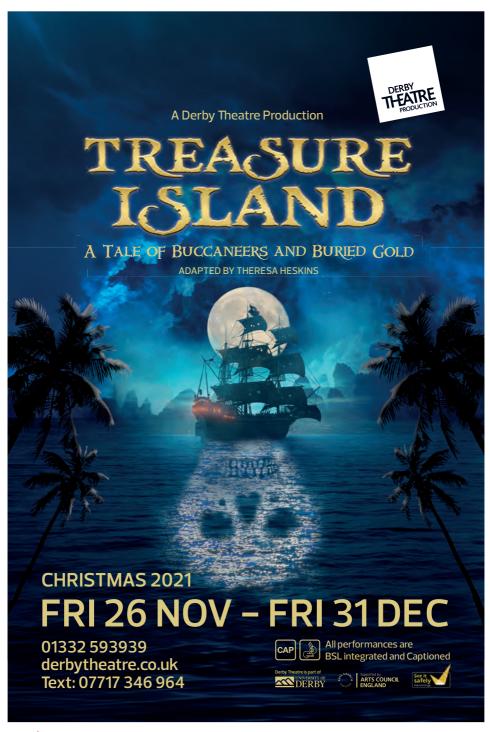
Bernard's future plans include the release of a comic book and 'The Rainy Day Zoo', as well as having a few confidential contracts with traditional

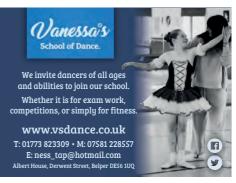

STARTING SCHOOL

The facts you need to know!

DATES AND APPLICATION PROCESS

If your child was born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018 they will be eligible to start school in September 2022. You should apply for their school place by 15 January 2022. Decisions will be notified 19 April 2022, National Offer Day. This is normally 16 April but is different for the 22-23 notifications because of the Easter holidays.

From 8 November 2021, you can fill in an application form online www.derbyshire.gov.uk/admissions which is quick and easy or alternatively you can apply by phoneplease call 01629 533190. You can state up to three school preferences for any primary or infant school.

Catholic primary schools give admission preference to Catholic children, however applications are very welcome from all parents and carers, regardless of faith or background, who'd like their children to be educated in a Christian environment.

DELAYING WHEN YOUR CHILD STARTS SCHOOL

You have the right to defer admission, or request your child attends part-time, until they reach compulsory school age (5 years old). If your child is summer born (with a birthday between 1 April and 31 August) and you defer their admission, when you apply for the following September, your child would normally start school in Year 1, however you can request they start in Reception; each case is considered individually and your request may not be accepted. Email admissions.transport@derbyshire.gov.uk or call 01629 537479 for more information.

VISITING POTENTIAL SCHOOLS

You can access school websites and Ofsted Reports online, but it's important to visit the schools you are considering to help you decide which school will best suit your child and their needs. Call the schools you wish to visit around mid-September and arrange a tour. These usually take place in October, sometimes individually, but often as a guided tour with other parents. You may take your child with you too.

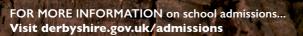

BOOK REVIEW: 'FIVE MINUTE MUM'

Sarah Taylor, avid Boom reader and local mum, discovered a great book to support her son Freddie's pre-school learning. She shares some of the fun activities she has used from the book...

Will I let him down?!

Although being a new mum is a wonderful thing and I cherish every moment, there is one thing that I completely underestimated: the sudden increase in my anxiety that arrived with this bundle of fun. It is something I'm sure many new parents can relate to; the constant questioning of myself, planning for every eventuality and finding new ways to keep him entertained drives me insane!

I eventually came across 'Five Minute Mum' by Daisy Upton after a long search for something to help keep the boredom at bay and stave off screen time. It's amazing! It is filled with 150+ games that take 5 minutes to set up & 5 minutes to tidy up and, as a bonus, they also support his learning! It explains how simple games can develop skills, how to utilise things you already have around the house, and even managed to get me up to speed on phonics- and that just scratches surface!

As my son is only three, some of the activities were a little beyond what he's ready for, but I don't mind that as it means this book is going to last me for years! However, there were some we could do and plenty I could adapt. Here's three of our favourites:

Peg It – pg. 62

I got some cheap wooden pegs and wrote an uppercase letter on one side and a lowercase letter on the other. I then worked with my son



to recognise the letters and identify its sound, before pegging it to a relevant object. He made a great start, sticking M on my top, G to Grandad and T on a train. It has now become the staple activity we take out so it can occupy him while waiting and everyone can join in too! I am sure it

will be a game we play for a long time.

Bond Boogie pg. 211 (adaptation)

I got some paper from my printer and drew on some dots using his felt tip pens. I then wrote I to I0 on individual sheets. My son then counted the dots and put them next to the appropriate number. We then jumped up and down and when we stopped, I asked him to jump on a sequence of numbers I gave him. Then he would give me some to jump on too; one little trick for this is to sometimes jump on the wrong one and see if he notices!

Letter Grid Alphabet Car Park pg. 67 (adaptation)



To create this grid, I use the lining of some old curtains and his felt tip pens. The grid included letters and shapes. He has to put a car on a letter and roll a dice (made from one of his blocks) that I marked 1, 2 or 3. We then have to find that number of things starting with that letter or are that shape. Quite difficult but with help and sound repetition, he is picking it up.

The activities are fun and have come in very useful when out for lunch with grandparents or playing inside when it's raining. I am now more confident in my ability to help my son progress in his learning and the activities help me understand where to focus my energies. They fit around everyday life as you can do them whenever and wherever you like!

If these activities sound exactly like what you've been looking for then look out for this book in Belper's very own indie bookshop, Bearded Badger Books at the 1924 building on Campbell Street.

There is also a website and social media channels featuring a wealth of information and ideas!

PUMPKIN SOUP BY HELEN COOPER - AGE: 3+

A duck, a cat and a squirrel make pumpkin soup every night in their old, white cabin in the woods. They each have a specific job; the cat cuts the pumpkin, the duck adds the salt and the squirrel stirs the soup - perfect! Or so it seems

One day, the little duck decides that, instead of squirrel, he would enjoy being head chef and pinches the wooden spoon off of its hook. Afterwards, squabbling erupts as the three animals argue over their pumpkin soup duties!

The animals' argument and eventual compromise is a powerful lesson for children about friendship, compassion and sharing. Its simple message, with beautiful illustrations and funny animal characters, will make your children laugh, learn and fall in love!



THE COLOUR MONSTER BY ANNA LIFNAS - AGF: 3+

Poor Colour Monster has woken up feeling very overwhelmed and his fur is covered in an emotional rainbow! Black, green, red and yellows are covering his woolly coat, making him feels tired, angry, calm, scared and happy all at once! Poor, poor monster!

To help him make sense of it all, a friendly girl explains what all these emotional colours mean: anger (red), calm (green), happy (yellow), scared (black), sad (blue) and love (pink). Together, they sort each feeling neatly into colour jars, allowing this sensitive monster to express himself more clearly. Because of this, Anna Llenas' beautiful illustrations play an important part in helping her child readers understand and communicate their own emotions.

The book deals with this complex subject sensitively and encourages healthy communication between children and their parents, carers or teachers. Perfect for any child struggling to understand their feelings, this book - with its colourful illustrations and clever message- is reading gold!

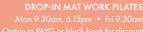

WORKING HARD OR HARDLY WORKING

Can exercise really keep our bodies healthier?

"There are many reasons people fall out of love with exercise: memories of unenjoyable PE lessons, life getting in the way or a lack of confidence but, for many, it's really about not knowing what to do. GENERATIONS OF STRUTTS

caring for our town and its people.

For so many years, Belper benefited from the Strutt family, who built the town's mills, and many of the houses and other buildings that make up our wonderful historic community.

There's no denying that they in turn benefited from the hard graft of their workers, but they did a lot in return (more than most people of their standing elsewhere) to provide homes and facilities for those workers over several generations. The first was Jedediah Strutt who built the first mill in 1776, and also early millworkers' houses and the Unitarian Chapel. This provision continued through to his great-great-grandson George Herbert Strutt who provided a fine school, swimming baths and the River Gardens early in the 20th century.

One of my favourite photographs of the Strutts is this one from the Belper Historical Society archive. Taken in 1888, it perfectly sums up the longevity of the family that shaped our town.



The little boy is George Ashton Strutt, who must at this stage have been just discovering the influence and importance of his family, and perhaps wondering what his role would be as he grew older. On the left is his father, George Herbert Strutt, acclaimed now as Belper's greatest benefactor. On the right is George Henry Strutt (another George!), grandfather to George Ashton, and at this stage in overall control of the Strutt mills in Belper and Milford. He looks a confident man, which is perhaps not surprising! They are sitting in the conservatory of Bridge Hill House, the family's main mansion, which once sat on the hillside above the Belper mills.

George Ashton Strutt's grandmother Agnes Strutt, and his aunts Lucy and Susan are in the second photograph, which was taken in 1862, also in Bridge Hill House. For many years, on Christmas Eve, Agnes and Susan would visit Long Row School to give out new clothing to the schoolchildren before their week's holiday. The family cared about their own children, but wanted to ensure that their workers' children would benefit a little from their wealth as well. particularly at Christmas.



You can find out more about the Strutt family and what they did for the town at Strutt's North Mill, the museum by Belper Bridge and the Horseshoe Weir.

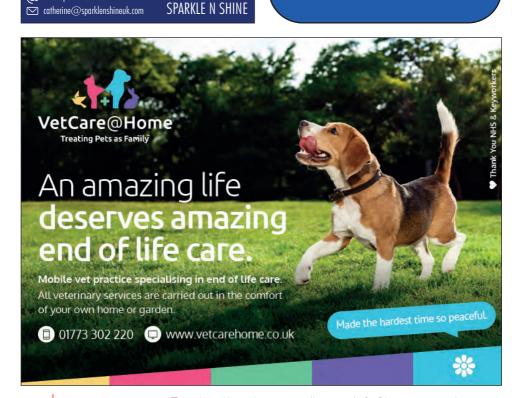

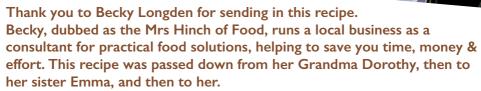

4 white onions

2 cloves garlic

2 tbsp plain flour

25ml dry white wine 1.5L of good beef stock

I baguette

Gruyere cheese, grated

You could also add a 1 tbsp of thyme & 1 tbsp of pepper

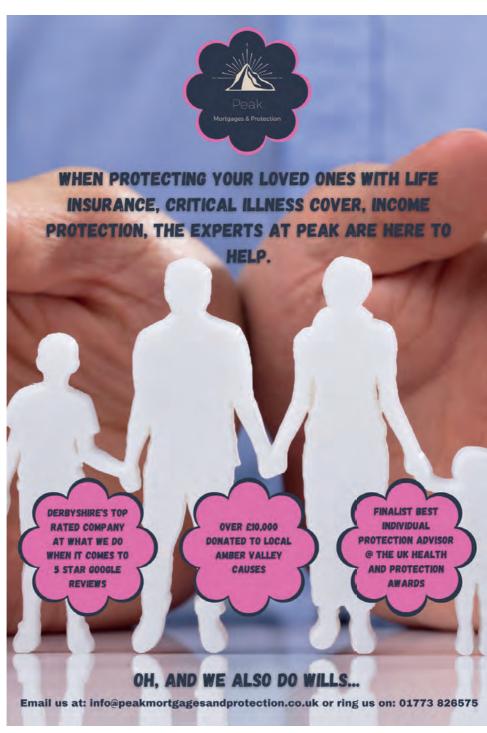
