


CHATSWORTH LOOP WITH A VIEW


There are many options for walks at Chatsworth but this one is great for kids and has the added benefit of being wheels-friendly for pushchairs, bikes, scooters and mobility scooters. It is a long, steady incline for the first part though so be aware of this when choosing to take wheels.

- **I.** Follow GPS to Chatsworth House, Bakewell, DE45 IPP. Park in the huge car park by the house & just pay for parking (£5). Walk towards the farmyard and playground and through the gate to your right signposted 'Stand Wood'.
- 2. Rather than entering the wood with 3 marked tracks, follow the concrete path steadily uphill along the back of the house. After about 500 metres, you'll glimpse the aqueduct feature up to your left why not go up to take a closer look. If you look back on yourself, you'll see Chatsworth House and the dome of the water steps in the gardens.
- **3.** Back on the main path signposted Swiss Cottage & Park Farm House follow it up for roughly 1km or so and then follow it around a sharp hairpin bend that takes you up onto the moor. Ignoring all tracks off the main path, continue until eventually you come to a crossroads.

- **4.** Turn left onto a gravel track signposted 'Swiss Cottage'. Follow the path weaving through fields until eventually you must bear left at the fork (instead of right which is the private road to the cottage).
- **5.** Continue with the pretty Swiss Lake and idyllic cottage on your right following this same track easily down to Emperor Lake where you cross over a bridge.
- **6.** Continue along the main track and then when you see a track turning off to the left ignore this and shortly after look for the elaborate Hunting Tower on your left, where there are fantastic views across the Derwent Valley. Stop here for a play around the canons and to admire the Chatsworth Estate.
- **7.** In front of the tower find the road that leads back downhill (or alternatively take the quicker but steep steps down). Following the road down, you'll pass the waterfall feature again, then turn sharp right at the bottom to return to the farmyard and house.


Woodland, a mock waterfall, lakes, canons, and great views **Gradient:**

A WALK AT CROMFORD CANAL

High Peak Junction, Cromford Canal and Woodlands.

This walk takes you down the flat and easy Cromford Canal, then over the High Peak Junction to see some disused railway cars and plenty of wildlife. Keep your eyes open for water voles, a variety of birds and maybe even a stegosaurus!

Take note of all the history surrounding you as this site has a wealth of industrial heritage and lies in the Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site.



DIRECTIONS

Park at Cromford Wharf Payand-Display Carpark - nearest postcode DE4 3RQ. (For a much shorter 1.2-mile walk, you can park at the High Peak Junction Pay-and-Display Carpark on Lea Road, DE4 5AE, and start at number 2)

- From Cromford Wharf, with the canal and Wheatcroft's Wharf Café in front of you, take a left and follow the canal path for one mile.
- When you reach the wooden bridge, cross over the canal. You are now at the junction of the Cromford Canal and the High Peak Trail. Here you will find some picnic tables and the old railway cars. There is also an information centre* selling refreshments and public toilets (8am-5pm daily) here. This part of the canal is a great place to see water voles. Listen out for their distinctive 'plop' as they disappear into the water.

You can also see Little Grebe birds, which like to dive under the water.

Once you have explored this area, turn left down the canal.

Follow the path with the canal on your left, passing an old warehouse, and take the left turning that follows the canal with Leawood Pump House in front of you. Carry on down the path with the canal still on your left.

Oross over the wooden bridge with the number 6 on it and take a look at the newly renovated Aqueduct Cottage *a project supported by the Derbyshire Wildlife Trust. Take the woodland public footpath signposted 'Lea Bridge'.

Follow the path over the railway track and through the woods. If you are lucky you will get to see a train pass

under you and receive a wave from the train driver!

Turn left, after the stone cottage and just before the chicken coop. Follow the narrow path between the two stone walls. Turn left again when you reach the road.

After Lea Wood House take your immediate left and follow the Public Footpath to High Peak Junction, cross the river, pass the sewage works and railway line.

This will bring you out to the High Peak Junction again. Turn right and follow the one-mile canal path back to your car.



HIDDEN HERITAGE

Discover more about the hidden heritage along the Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site

In recent months, work has been progressing along Derbyshire's 15-mile-long Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site to create an interesting and fun way for discovering the history of some its key communities – Belper, Milford and Darley Abbey.

A whole series of information panels have been created, some of them on special stands, designed by a blacksmith, to look like the waterwheels that once powered the valley's first mills, at the start of the Industrial Revolution.

As well as information, the boards will point you towards the next one in the series, and tell you what to look out for on the way.

There's also a heritage trail for each place, with a number of waterwheel-shaped plaques attached to important buildings, with a line of information and a QR code, so you can use your



phone to see photographs of those buildings in the past, or the people associated with them.

The Darley Abbey boards and waterwheel plaques were installed in March, and construction of the Belper and Milford boards is nearly complete and they'll be appearing during May.

Once they are all installed, there's a chance to explore and find out

more about these places, and the history which made the Derwent Valley a World Heritage Site.

On the next few pages, you'll find a map showing where all the boards and heritage trail plaques can be found in Belper, and a few things to look for when you work your way around the trail.






DISCOVERING BELPER'S HIDDEN HISTORY

Here are nine questions you can find the answers to on the new Belper Heritage Trail. You'll need a mobile phone with a camera for the Information Points (waterwheel plaques) so you can use the QR codes. Without a phone you can still use the Heritage Boards.

Start in the Coppice Car Park (DE56 IFZ) just off the Market Place. By the entrance is a Heritage Board. If you read it you'll find out the answer to this question:

I) What was the Duffield Frith? (Hint: the answer is in the section named 'The Deer Park')

Enter the Market Place and walk up to the No.28 Community Hall. On the wall in front of the building is an Information Point (waterwheel plaque). Use your phone camera to scan the QR code and you'll then be able to read about the Market Place. You should then be able to answer this question:

2) The Salvation Army
Citadel opened in 1935

- what is it now? (Hint: the

answer is in the section named 'William Booth and the Salvation Army')

Cross the Market Place and you'll see a new Heritage Board on a waterwheel stand, close to the pedestrian crossing. If you read it you'll find out the answer to this question:

3) In what year did the River Derwent freeze over and the locals played football on it? (Hint: the answer is in the section named 'The Market')



Use the crossing, then walk down King Street to the Memorial Gardens. Just inside the entrance on the left-hand wall you'll see another Heritage Board. If you read it you'll find out the answer to this question:

4) When was this wooden bridge built across King Street? (Hint: the answer is in the section 'The Bridge')

Opposite the Memorial Gardens entrance is Green Lane. Cross over and walk along Green Lane. When you reach Field Lane on your left, turn down there and look for an Information Point on the wall to your left, near a set of gates. Use your phone camera to scan the QR code.

5) What year was the Anglican order of the Sisters of St Laurence founded? (Hint: the answer is in the section named 'The Convent of St Laurence')

Keep walking down Field Lane, and at the railway bridge cross the road and look for an Information Point on the wall next to a footpath (called 'a channel' in Belper). Use your phone camera to scan the QR code.

6) What is the name of the channel (footpath)? (Hint: the answer is in the heading!)

Walk along the footpath and at the end you'll see another Information Point on the wall opposite.

7) When did the railway line open? (Hint: the answer is in the section named 'The Railway Cutting')

Turn left to the bottom of the road, then right along Cluster Road until the end, when you'll come out on Long Row, opposite a school. Turn left again, and at the bottom of Long Row you'll see a Heritage Board by the playground wall.

8) What were these children celebrating in

1937? (Hint: the answer is in the caption below this photograph on the board)



Cross the main A6 road at the crossing. On The Triangle you'll see another Heritage Board on a waterwheel stand.

9) How many bricks were needed to build the big red East Mill? (Hint: the answer is in the section named 'The East Mill')

From here, you can find more panels on either side of the bridge over the River Derwent, and in the River Gardens. When you return to your starting point, walk straight up Long Row and you'll find more information points on the railway bridge at Long Row and on Green Lane, at the Field Row junction. Enjoy exploring!


















CELEBRATING A CORONATION

Like the rest of the country, there was a mad rush to buy television sets in Derbyshire in the weeks leading up to June 2nd 1953 - Coronation Day. There were thousands in the county by then, and on the day all were surrounded by a host of avid watchers, with family, friends and neighbours invited in to see a ceremony that had never been seen publicly before.

For those with no access to a television, there

were events in most of the towns and villages as well, although not for the first time on the day of a royal celebration, storm clouds and showers threatened but failed to dampen people's enthusiasm.

Many communities started the day with church or openair services before the new

Queen's subjects moved on to enjoy a host of street parties, lunches and games. Pictured is one celebration at Openwoodgate where there was a huge fancy dress parade.

In Belper, like most towns, every child was given

a souvenir commemorative mug, provided by the local council. A number of firms floodlit their premises to make the town look extra special for the big day. In the evening many sight-seers toured the town to see all the illuminations.

The English Sewing Cotton
Company also illuminated the weir, and the
Jubilee clock tower on the West Mill was lit up
in red, white and blue (pictured).

It was wet and rainy when Queen Elizabeth's father, George VI, was crowned in May 1937. Denby Pottery was busy in the run-up to the big day. They produced the commemorative mug for all the local schoolchildren that time – there was also a commemorative book given out to children as well.

Civic processions and special services were planned for that day, and there were sporting

events and coronation teas to enjoy.

When King Edward VII was crowned in 1902, it had been 64 years since the previous coronation – Victoria's – so, like us, there were many people with no memories of how coronations should be celebrated.

But one elderly writer contacted The Belper News with a memory of celebrations for the coronation of George IV held 81 years earlier, on July 19th 1821. In 1821, there was no street lighting, yet the festivities across the county lasted long past sunset. To ensure that every

reveller arrived home safely that night, candles or lanterns were lit and placed in the front windows of houses facing onto the main streets. This 'magical' effect impressed all who saw it in 1821, and the letter writer suggested it be repeated for future coronations.



Here are some round-ups of what is on offer...

Cromford Mills

Ever wanted to put your children to work in the mill? Well, at Cromford Mills you can.

Once a thriving cotton-spinning mill, Cromford Mills is now a family-friendly visitor attraction nestled in the Derwent Valley Mills World Heritage Site. With cafes, shops and ducks galore to feed, you'll always have a good day at the mill – but if you want to dig into the history of the place, that's where the real treasure lies.

Ecclesbourne Valley Railway

The Duffield Junction to Wirksworth branch line was opened by the Midland Railway in 1867, with stations at **Duffield, Shottle, Idridgehay** and **Wirksworth**. This carried passengers until 1947. The line served as an important link for local produce, including many thousands of tons of limestone carried by rail from the quarries around Wirksworth until 1989.

In the year 2000, volunteers cleared the 9 mile line and restored it as a heritage railway. It took I I years of hard work with the line reopening with steam trains on 8th April 2011. Since then, the line has gone from strength to strength and regularly holds **special events** and **dining experiences** in addition to **steam and heritage diesel trains**. A particularly special occasion came in October 2015 when the now



King Charles III visited the railway and rode on the train to Duffield, meeting young volunteers during the journey. Look out for our popular events throughout the year including Easter & Christmas train rides, classic bus rallies, galas, miniature railway exhibitions, Wirksworth Wizarding day & more!

Denby Pottery

William Bourne, a local potter, visited the seam of clay discovered at **Denby in 1806** and instantly recognised its qualities. In 1809 a pottery was started next to the clay seam.

The pottery stayed in the **Bourne family** for many years and with each new generation the pottery made at Denby has been shaped to suit the needs of the times, from the very first salt glazed stoneware bottles and jars, through to domestic pottery such as jelly moulds and ceramic hot water bottles.

The pottery also worked with many artists and designers, to make sure it kept up with the **current fashions in homeware** and has invented and perfected many handcrafting



techniques and unique glazes that Denby's craftspeople still use at Denby Pottery today to create its iconic designs.

Markeaton Park

Markeaton Park is Derby's most visited park and is one of the most popular attractions in the East Midlands. But behind the modern day park lays a fascinating history that is waiting to be discovered. The park as we know it today can be traced back to the **medieval period**, when the first park was laid out. It was sold to the **Mundy family** in 1516. Over the following centuries the park went through many changes, from arable fields to an enclosed designed **18th century park and hall** and finally at the beginning of the 20th century The Mundy family gave Markeaton Park to **Derby City Council** who made it into the public park of today.

The park has many features that mark this history: ancient veteran trees, historic lost roads, old arable field patterns, the 18th century park and buildings





and the remains of a **Second World War army** camp.

Today you will find the aptly named Mundy Play Centre offering 3 fantastic playgrounds, a **boating** lake, canoes, ride-on cars, donkey rides, a crazy golf course and a giant paddling pool.

Transport yourself back to 1750... Matlock Bath was full of wealthy Georgian tourists who believed that 'taking the waters' of Matlock Bath would do wonders for their health. Ex-miners became tour guides, showing the wealthy tourists around the mines for a high price.


In 1974, the present owners bought the estate and had great visions for the future. After 10 years of restoring the Heights to its former glory, they decided the site needed something new to please the modern tourists. This was when the cable car was built, making the ascent to the summit easy, and creating a unique experience for UK tourists.


